Unit 3: Week 3

Essential Question: What do we know about Earth and its neighbors in space?

Genre: Expository Text

- An expository text presents facts, information, and photos to inform a reader about a topic. It can include charts and keywords to help the reader better understand a topic.

Comprehension Strategy: Summarize

- When a reader summarizes, they give the most important ideas and details in a text. This helps a reader better understand the text.

Comprehension Skill: Main Idea & Key Details

- The main idea is the most important point the author makes about a topic. Key details tell about the main idea.

Vocabulary Strategy: Suffixes -y, -ly

- A word part that is added to the beginning of a word is called a prefix. They change the meaning of a word.

Writing Trait: Organization-Strong Paragraphs

- A strong paragraph has a topic sentence that tells about the main idea. Other sentences tell about the main idea.

Spelling: r-Controlled Vowels /ar/ and /ir/
